What?

The European Researchers' Night (NIGHT) is a Europe-wide public event to enhance researchers' public recognition and to stimulate interest in research careers, especially amongst young people.

Who?

Any legal organisation in the EU and in the 16 countries associated to Horizon 2020 may apply to set up an open-to-all event.

When?

Last Friday of September. It is possible to organise pre-events during spring or summer prior to the main event in September.

How?

For example: science shows, display of films, quizzes, competitions and contests, debates, sport-linked activities involving both researchers and public, exhibitions, workshops, specific programme for young people, crime investigation, riddles solved by the public with the support of researchers or presentation of prototypes.

From €8 million to €12 million.
