The European Gender Summit is hosted at the European Parliament due to the gracious support by a number of MEPs, including Britta Thomsen, Teresa Riera Madurell, Marita Ulvskog, Joanna Senyszyn, Antigoni Papadopoulou and Kent Johansson.

Based on the success of the first summit and the Manifesto for Integrated Action on the Gender Dimension in Research and Innovation, this unique event will bring together top-level policy makers, science leaders and innovation stakeholders to align agendas and to identify the best ways for integrating the gender dimension in the research and innovation landscape. Key experts will discuss the latest research evidence showing how gender issues impact on quality of research and innovation, and help advance society's capacity to create:

- innovative and inclusive societies by engaging and recognising the needs of women and men as equal co-owners and co-solvers of the challenges facing society (e.g. health and wellbeing)
- socially responsible and responsive science by drawing on the talents and needs of both women and men in solving mission-oriented problems (e.g. diabetes)
- excellence in research and innovation in all Member States by encouraging mobility of talented women scientists across national and regional R&D science systems
- cooperative and collaborative research and innovation cultures by creating interdisciplinary 'bridges' between fields where women are underrepresented (e.g. photonics) and where they are overrepresented (e.g. life sciences)
- cooperation between private sector, SMEs, and public bodies by developing new, gender-aware markets for science knowledge and using gender as a 'big ticket' item for improving research quality and performance
- smart specialization and exploitation of scientific knowledge based on discoveries of important biological differences between women and men (e.g. biomarkers) and where women and men have different needs (e.g. diagnostics), or preferences (e.g. energy use)
- economic and societal impact of research by promoting problem-driven research (e.g. effective transport), and using gendered innovations for deployment of enabling technologies (e.g. ICTs)
- excellent and efficient innovation landscape based on more open, inclusive, and gender sensitive approaches for identifying best ideas and markets for science knowledge.
