#### Issues raised by EP

- Single Funding model V Simplification;
- EP believes Funding model doesn't cover all costs and will make projects more expensive; EP proposes a full cost and differentiated funding model in contrast to the single funding rate agreed by the Commission and Council. This goes against the simplification concept agreed by the Commission and the Council.
- EP wants "earmarking" of certain areas, e.g.
- 75% of the Energy Challenge budget for renewable energies,
- 15% for Intelligent Energy Europe,
- 4% for the SME Instrument.
