Strategy of Internationalization of the Slovenian Science and Research (2018-2030) in preparation – one of the priority areas of the international scientific cooperation for Slovenia are Western Balkan Countries.

- Slovenia signed Declaration of Intent – Establishment of a South East European International Institute for Sustainable Technologies (25 October 2017).

BILATERAL COOPERATION:

BOSNIA AND HERZEGOVINA

- 36 bilateral projects adopted for the period 2016-2017 successfully finished;
- launch of the new joint call for research projects between Slovenia and Bosnia and Herzegovina is planned to be announced in September;

THE FORMER YUGOSLAV REPUBLIC OF MACEDONIA

- 15 bilateral projects adopted for the period 2017-2018 are in the process of realization;

MONTENEGRO

- 26 bilateral projects for the period 2016-2017 are successfully finished,
- the joint call for research projects between Slovenia and Montenegro for 2018-2020 is closed and Mixed committee meeting is planned to be held at the beginning of July in Podgorica;

SERBIA

- 55 bilateral projects for the period 2018 – 2019 have been approved at the Mixed commission meeting held in Ljubljana end of May 2018 in Ljubljana.
