Building on the success of the three previous Doctoral conferences of 2006, 2007, and 2008, which have been consistently attracting more than 100 papers from countries in all South East Europe and beyond (UK, France, Germany, Holland, Slovenia, Hungary, Poland and as far as Ukraine), we are pleased to announce the organisation of the 4th Annual South East European Doctoral Student Conference.

The aim of the conference is to further facilitate the exchange of knowledge between young researchers and to consolidate the established network of scholars currently undertaking research in the region of South East Europe (and beyond). Having identified academic isolation as a problem that many doctoral students face today, the South East European Doctoral Student Conference aims to bring researchers together for establishing collaborative links between disciplines, for testing the ground for innovative ideas and for engaging the wider academic community.

The Conference has an inter-disciplinary focus and is open for participation to young researchers who are currently undertaking doctoral study or are in the early years of their research career (up to 2 years following award of their PhD degree). All submitted abstracts will undergo a peer-review process by members of the Programme Committee. Authors of accepted abstracts will be invited to present their work at the conference and will be asked to submit full versions of their papers to be included in the conference proceedings. During the conference, each paper will be presented in front of a panel of experts consisting of academics with significant research expertise and experience in supervising doctoral students. Each presentation will be followed by feedback from the members of the panel and questions from the audience. In addition to the discussions that will be held during the presentations, there will be general discussion sessions guided by the members of the expert panels, addressing various issues relating to research methodology and PhD work. The proceedings of the 4th Annual South East European Doctoral Student Conference will be edited and published by SEERC. After the conference, authors of selected papers may be invited to submit extended versions for publication in Special Issues of specialized journals (e.g. the International Journal of Innovation and Regional Development. Link: http://www.inderscience.com/ijird). The invited submissions will follow a separate double-blind reviewing procedure according to the standards of these journals.
